

Your Board of Trustees, at its March meeting, approved the purchase of video cameras for our parking lot and finalized the makeup of the



Rebirth and Recommitment

It is spring which means something a bit different in Florida than it does in colder climates but it is still a time filled with possibility. Many of us start to plan vacations, a return to northern homes, the end of the school year and the end of the church program year. This has been a puzzling spring because unlike many years Easter came very early and is totally disconnected in time from Passover. It has made our planning a bit challenging. The themes of rebirth and liberation are the basic themes of the historical religious holidays. For us as Unitarian Universalists it could be a time of recommitment to work on some form of rebirth and liberation for ourselves and our spiritual home.



Our church could really use some liberation from our constant financial crises. One way we could move toward a reborn community with a new identity of abundance, rather than our old and worn out narrative of perpetual scarcity, is for each and everyone of you to reevaluate what this community means to you and what your are willing to sacrifice to keep it viable. Clearly, to create a sustainable church we must have both more members and a greater time and financial commitment from those folks already here. The only alternative to those two things happening is a loss of some of our services and staffing. Those losses do not seem acceptable to any of you. Generosity is a spiritual discipline and many among you are already most generous. However, since we are not primarily a community of wealthy people, generosity may have to mean giving more than we are really comfortable giving. Your whole staff is already donating literally thousands and thousands of dollars worth of services as we are all paid at substantially below the recommended UUA Fair Compensation scale.

We are currently living in nerve racking times politically and financially and it may become easier and easier to blame the general economic climate for a cutting back on giving to churches. When you think about it however, when do you need your church community most? When times are tough of course! So in reality maybe your giving to your church should double when times are hard. Celia Kingman Miller in her prize winning sermon called "The Land of Enough" has this to say: "I have tithed for nearly ten years to my church home, and it gives me a profound spiritual freedom and grace. Tithing tells me that the income I earn- large or small – does not define who I am. Tithing teaches me over and over, about my dependence upon others and theirs upon me. Ultimately, it teaches me to place my trust in something other than money, to understand that my security does not lie material things but rather in community."

Over the coming months, I will be offering other thoughts on how generosity of all kinds can become part of the spiritual paths that will eventually lead us to a spiritual community.

UUA's General Assembly 2008, Ft. Lauderdale—Planning Update

<u>Volunteers:</u> As I write this on March 5th your volunteer applications are being collected at the GA Convention Services office through the month of March. They'll then be sent to Sue Boone, Volunteer Coordinator, who at the time you are reading this, April 15, will be assigning the applicants to the various job slots they have asked for, are qualified for, and/or who have been requested by the other members of the Volunteer Committee. A good response to our recruitment efforts may well mean that some applicants will not make the cut. Our regrets go out to you and our thanks for being willing to help out. And our congratulations go to those who do make the cut. We look forward to your joining the crew that will guarantee a smoothly successful General Assembly in June!

Service Project: Thanks to the expert and detailed work of Lori Gold, Service Project Coordinator, the six evaluators (Dick Hattwick and Arthur O'Brien of the First UU Congregation of the Palm Beaches, Janice McArthur and Joyce Anderson of the UU Congregation of Miami, and Ken Bresnehan, and the Rev. Naomi King of the River of Grass UU Congregation), and consultant Mary Anne Richardson of the UU Church of Fort Lauderdale, we have chosen the winner, Hispanic Unity of Florida (HUF). Their mission statement: "Empower Hispanics and other members of our community to become self-sufficient

and lead productive lives." The project that those attending GA will contribute to will enhance HUF's Education and Training Center facilities where they offer citizenship classes, voter registration efforts, employment resources, immigration legal services, and free tax preparation services.

<u>Transportation</u>: Ronnie VanSickle, Transportation Coordinator, in conjunction with Jan Sneegas, Director of GA Convention Services, by April 5th will have nailed down a contract with one of the three bus companies submitting proposals to supply the shuttle buses for GA. The buses will make the 15-minute circuit covering seven of the nine hotels (the Renaissance and Grande are within easy walking distance) and the Convention Center throughout the day and evening.

<u>Accessibility</u>: Patty Cameron, Accessibility Coordinator, has made several trips to Fort Lauderdale using her expertise of many years to scout out any problems in advance and plan accordingly for those with special needs during GA.
